God's word is <u>absolute</u> truth. (This is what the Bible says.)

God is truth. He is the source of reality. What He does, what He wills, and who He is, is reality! Since He does not change, it means that this reality is eternal- it is absolute for all people everywhere all of the time! Truth can only be discovered or revealed. It is never invented or altered by a culture or men.

Man's word is <u>relative</u> truth. (This is what the world believes.)

Truth is determined by man and his view in his culture. It believes that everything is relative. Nothing is fixed, it is all a matter of personal perspective, which is always subject to change. It can never be discovered because it is always being changed by the subjective perspective of finite creatures.
